

# WHY IS YOUR ROOF A CRITICAL INVESTMENT?

#### **EXTERNAL FACTORS**

Seasonal and weather changes play a major role in the aging process of your roof. Other factors such as hail, tree limbs, and snow loads can contribute to the degradation of your shingles.

#### INTERNAL FACTORS

Improperly ventilated air space inhibits air movement and this can contribute to moisture buildup. Moisture causes deterioration, which ultimately affects the performance of your shingles.

Your roof is a critical investment; it protects you and your family from the elements.

## ESSENTIAL QUESTIONS TO ASK YOUR ROOFING CONTRACTOR

#### ARE YOU LICENSED, INSURED, AND CAN YOU PROVIDE REFERENCES?

This is the most important question you can ask, and it is always good to get references from past customers.

### DO YOU PLAN TO TEAR OFF THE OLD SHINGLES AND PULL THE NAILS?

Removing the old roofing materials allows the roofing contractor to inspect the sheathing and expose any problems with the roof surface. It also provides a smooth surface that is easy to waterproof and roof over. (Not removing old roofing materials can affect your warranty.)

### HOW WILL YOU CHARGE FOR ANY EXTRA WORK?

It's hard to know the condition of the roof surface until the shingles are removed. Has your roofing contractor included an hourly rate in your contract for any extras?

#### WILL YOU REPLACE DAMAGED OR RUSTED FLASHING?

A common roof leak site is the intersection of a roof and a wall. It's always best to replace the step and valley flashing, but it can be difficult in some cases. Make sure your roofing contractor inspects the flashing and explains options.



### WILL YOU REPLACE THE ROOF VENTS AND VALLEY FLASHING?

Replacing these materials only adds a few hundred dollars to the cost of a typical roof and ensures a leak-proof job. Ask to use metal that is prefinished to match your shingle color.

#### **Other Considerations**

If you're installing gutters, the most common are seamless aluminum. The quality of these installations can vary; so hire a contractor who has been in business for several years and can provide examples of past work.

Roofing contractors should also be able to recommend a gutter installation contractor with whom they have worked on past projects.

Note: Make sure your roofing contractor provides you with a project timeline and don't make the final payment until every detail is complete.
